Executive Summary

Profile of the College

The Govt. Khawzawl College is located in the North eastern part of Khawzawl town. The college was established in 1985. It is a co-educational institution. The vision and mission is to provide higher education especially to the students of this area who cannot get the facility of higher education in other places. It aims to prepare the students ready for all types of competitive examination for making their career, to develop a sense of responsibility and participation in the developmental activities which are of larger interest with a feeling of nationalism.

The college is affiliated to Mizoram University, Aizawl and imparts the following subjects.

- 1. Economics
- 2. Education
- 3. English
- 4. History
- 5. Mizo

6. Political Science

The college abides by the government policy of education and follows the syllabi prepared by the Affiliating University. However the institution has some specific goals and objectives depending on the cultural and educational needs of the people of the area. The main objectives and goals are to cater all round development of the society. The TDC courses offered are to be completed in six semesters within three years. Every department maintains log book and the same is monitored by the Co-ordinator IQAC and the Principal.

The newly admitted students are given awareness about the system of the institution every year in their first entry in the college. The college follows the academic activities issued by the affiliating university. The University has introduced

25% internal evaluation system for all the colleges in the state. For General English another 15 marks for practical examination in spoken English is also to be examined internally.

The institution promotes research/project works for faculty members funded by various agencies like UGC, ICSSR etc. But the institution does not have financial allocations for research project. Most of the faculty members have presented papers in various state and national level seminars. The college organizes college week every year where the students are exposed to sports, cultural and literary items. Our students brought laurels in district level football tournaments. The college conducted a number of lectures in collaboration with other governments and non government departments. NSS camps and other extension activities are also conducted every year.

The NSS cells of the college carry out extension service at regular intervals.

Activities such as blood donation, health and sanitation campaign, awareness campaign regarding education, HIV, Red Ribbon etc. are conducted in targeted areas.

The college is located in an extensive area of 12444.69 sq. metres having a women hostel, Boy's Hostel, Basket ball cum Volley Ball Court, Table Tennis etc. . The college has Wi- Fi facility. Unfortunately the internet provider (BSNL) has several problems as it is a hilly and lightning prone area. The college has adopted innovative practice to fulfill the growing teaching-learning needs and promotes the use of modern technology such as projector, computer, internet and other audio-visual support systems.

The college publishes updated prospectus before the beginning of every academic year. The prospectus provides all the information about the college, regarding curricular, co-curricular activities, details of faculties, staff, etc. An eco-friendly academic atmosphere is always maintained in the campus to give quality education. Admission of the students in the college in the first semester is based on criteria as laid down by the admission committee from time to time. Lectures and other programmes are organized in various areas time to time. Coaching classes are also conducted as and when opportunities are available.

Although there are deficiencies in infrastructure in the college it is committed to effective and optimum use of the existing ones in order to facilitate its students compete with their counterparts of other parts in the country. Counseling by the faculty members are done as and when situation permits by motivating the

students towards progression to higher level of education as well as their employment after the course.

The government policies made at the state level are implemented in true spirit. The responsibilities of quality management are carried out by the faculty members under the leadership of the Principal and IQAC. In order to carry out and maintain discipline among the students some faculty members are given responsibilities to guide and advise in different areas.

The college is environment conscious and has planted trees in the campus as well as in different areas of the locality. A big water harvesting tank (30000 liters approx) and 1 GCI sheet containers (8000 liters) are all set to harvest water during the rainy season.

The college publishes 'college magazine' to promote the writing abilities in the college. Both students and staff contribute articles in the publication.

The IQAC of the college was established on 18th August 2006 in line with the new methodology of NAAC to ensure quality assurance on a continuous basis within the academic and administrative system. Previously the college had Steering Committee to look into these matters. The college also maintains an In-House Academic Calendar. Periodical academic reviews and discussion on different issues and problems of the college at different levels are held on regular basis.

The college has a number of challenges to meet such as opening of job oriented courses for achieving professional requirement by the students, opening of science and commerce subjects, Wi-Fi facilities from other reliable companies, smart classes and other modern facilities. The college looks forward to achieve and fulfill its aspiration so that the students and the people of this remote place can be placed at the level of main land standard.

INTRODUCTION

Govt. Khawzawl College initially named as Khawzawl College was established in 4th March 1985 under management of Local Board with a very few Staff of the College namely R.Lalrintluanga as Principal, Shri W.C.Thandawla M.A(Eng) and Shri C.Laldailova M.A.(Pol.Sc.) as Lecturers and Shri R.Vanlallawma and Shri Hmingthanga Varte as Part-Time Lecturer.

After passing almost 9 years, this College was given Permission by the Govt.of Mizoram Vide Letter No.B.16019/3/88-EDC/1-2 Dated 24th July 1989 and the Government has accorded the Provisional Permission again for opening this College Vide Govt.Letter No.B.16019/5/90-EDC Dated 24th Jan 1990. Hence, Management of the College was in the hands of Governing Board Member of which selected by the Government from time to time(namely for the period of 2 years) representing Teaching Community Lady, and Local Prominent persons and University etc. And the Board was also registered on 14/3/1990 under Regd No. SR4 of 1990. This College got Provisional Affiliation on 15/5/1992 from NEHU Vide Letter No.CDC/A-75/99-1468 Dated 15/5/92 and the Affiliating University had given permission for conducting Pre-university Examinations with effect from 1993 Vide NEHU Letter No.F.15-2/Ex/92/350/ Dated 31/11/1992. This College was upgraded to Deficit Status with effect from 1st April 1994 Vide Govt. Letter No. B.16013/3/90-EDC/55 Dated 22/7/94. In 1995 Govt. of Mizoram had accorded Provisional Permission to this College for opening Degree Class with effect from the Academic Session 1995-96 in the subjects of English, Mizo, Pol.Science, History ,Education and Economics Vide Letter No.B.16019/3/88-EDC Dated 9th Nov 1995. After Inspecting this College for Degree classes NEHU also gave Provisional Affiliation for Degree Classes to this College in General and Honour Courses Vide NEHU letter No. DCD.A.78/95-96/1778 Dated 16th July 1999.

After Establishment of Mizoram University, Affiliated Colleges within Mizoram was transferred to Mizoram University from NEHU and this College was also applying Permanent Affiliation to Mizoram University. Accordingly Mizoram University resolved to grant Permanent Affiliation to this College Vide University Letter No. MZU/CDC/32/2002 Dated 27th July 2006 with effect from 1st July 2006.

University Grants Commission (UGC) included this College in the list of College prepared under Section 2(f) & 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956 with effect from the date of issue of the order Vide UGC Letter No. F.8-432/2005(CPP-1) Dated 20th July 2007.

With a view to attain qualitative improvement in Higher Education, the Govt. of Mizoram Provincialised this College with effect from the date of issue of this Notification Vide No.B.16013/1/07-EDC Dated 11th Oct 2007. Nos. of Teaching and Non-Teaching faculties at the time of Provincialisation was: Principal-1, Teaching Staff-18 nos and Non-Teaching Staff-9.

All the Authority exercised by the Governing Board of the College during Private and Deficit Status was handover to Government of Mizoram since this College become Provincialised College.

PART-II OF SELF-STUDY REPORT

<u>Criterion Wise Summary</u>

1. Criterion I : CURRICULAR ASPECTS :

Govt. Khawzawl College is basically an undergraduate co-education College. The curriculum is designed by the affiliating University which carried out by the College within the frame work laid down by the concerned University. Initially the College was started with Pre-University Courses in 1985 and subsequently became Degree Arts College in 1987. The University invites some of the teachers of the College to participate in the Committees of curriculum from time to time. The teachers sincerely tried to share and cooperate reproduce a new and suitable one.

2. Criterion II: TEACHING, LEARNING AND EVALUATION:

Admission to the College is very fair and transparent. No stringent Rules for Admission is operated as well as possible efforts are made to accommodate any applicants who passed the +2 Level from any recognized Institutions. At the opening of each session, teachers prepared lesson plans which are tabled in a special session of the IQAC to monitor teaching schedule through out the while semester through Casual Departmental discussions. Students are compelled to participate Seminar, Mid-Term Exam, Unit Test, Quiz, Group discussion and to submit Assignment within the stipulated period. Special emphasis is made on the Attendance of students. Students attend less/than 75% of Attendance are debarred to fill up End Semester. Remedial Coaching Classes in various subjects for students belonging to Scheduled Tribes/Scheduled Castes have been conducted as per UGC Guidelines with the financial Assistance of UGC. Internet facility is provided to the students in and around the College Campus during Office hours in all working days. (Students evaluation of teachers conducted once in a Semester regularly by the IQAC of the College).

As per UGC guidelines, the teachers participated Refresher Courses, Orientation Programmes, Seminar, Workshop, Conference in various Topics organized by Universities in the Country which refresh and update their knowledge in their particular subjects. In such way, National linkage are established to the teachers. API Form is an integral part of the evaluation for teachers for their promotion to the next grade. Evaluation methods of Semester System are illustrated to the students of 1st Semester at the beginning of new Academic Session. Students' evaluation of teachers conducted once in a Semester regularly by the IQAC of the College. The Results obtained from the students provide an opportunity of the teachers to improve and satisfy themselves.

3. CRITERION – III RESEARCH CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION

As the College is an Under-Graduate College, neither Post-Graduate nor Research Scholars facilities is provided. But teachers can proceed Research Work on Study Leave as per Government Rules. Teachers are encouraged to write and published their works and to organize, participate present papers on Seminars and Workshop. The Staff and students of this College take an active part in different extension activities such as Blood Donation, HIV/AIDS Awareness, Environmental Awareness, Deforestation Awareness, Drug Awareness Campaign, Anti-Communal Awareness etc. The NSS Unit of the College performed many remarkable activities. Education Tour at various Historical places of the State are organized every year. Educational Tour at outside of the State is occasionally organized from time to time. The Institution carried out many works in coordination with various numbers of Government Office and Organisations such as Local Hospital, Local Administrative Departments, DRDA,VCP,etc. and Non-Governmental Organisation like Young Mizo Association of Khawzawl Block, MHIP(Mizo Hmeichhe Insuihkhawm Pawl),Officers' Club of Khawzawl etc.

4. CRITERION-IV INFRASTRUCTURE & LEARNING RESOURCES:

The existing Infrastructure of the College comprises a main Lecture Building consisting of 11(eleven) Classrooms, Administrative Building, Girls Hostel(capacity 20 students), Boys' Hostel(capacity 10 students), Canteen, Students' Common Room, T.T.Hall, Basketball, Volley Ball Court, Library Room with 4500 books approximately, 1(one) IQAC of office room. The College is planning to construct a separate Library Building and a Conference Hall. The NSS Unit and Beautification Committee joined hands to make the Campus clean and green. The College formed various Committees and Cells for better functioning of every sections of the Institutions. The Library subscribes only 7(seven) journals/periodical. All through the Library provides Internet facility, and Xerox facility to the students from 9:00 Am-4:00 Pm on all working days. Students take part in different items of Games and Sports during the College Week and Inter College Sports and Local Tournaments. The outstanding players are awarded prizes and Certificate of Appreciation. Better Infrastructure of Games & Sports are required to be installed.

The main activities of the Govt. Khawzawl College is generally focus on the student. Maximum percentage of students of this College go through examination with flying colour every year in general. A good number of students continued further studies in different parts of the country, and some of them got employment in different Departments of State Government and even in the College itself. The authority of the College notified all the requirement through local News Paper such as norms of Admission, latest Prospectus, Fee structure, subject combination, Salient Features of Semester System Examination with distribution of Marks of Mid-Term and End Semester Examination. The students of this College are awarded Post-Matric Scheduled Tribe/Scheduled Castes Scholarship as per the norms of the State Government. Although the College is

having Infrastructural limitation, it indoor Sports, Games, Debates, Cultural Programmes, Dances, Music Competitions in different forms etc.

The College is governed by Higher & Technical Education, Govt. of Mizoram. The students are encouraged to participate co-curricular activities and games and sports. Teaching and non-teaching Staff maintained Self Appraisal Form for assessment in Annual Confidential Report. A BRIEF REPORT OF REMEDIAL COACHING COURSES

The Govt. Khawzawl College Principal, Staff and students are extremely grateful to the University Grants Commission for generously sanctioning funds for the introduction of Remedial Coaching Courses for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students of this College.

Under XI Plan the University Grants Commission was gracenes enough to sanction Rs. 4,00,000/- (Rupees four lakh) out of which Rs. 2,00,000/-(Rupees two lakh) was for non-recurring and the rest Rs. 2,00,000/-(Rupees two lakh) was for recurring expenses. For the first time the Course was organized in this College from 1st April 2010 to 31st March 2011. In the first year of its introduction in 2010 to 2011, altogether 639 lectures of 1 hour duration were organized outside the normal College working hours. The Remedial Coaching Class on the basis of the fiscal, appraisal and other reports submitted to the UGC, the Commission was pleased to sanction Rs. 7,00,000/-(Rupees seven lakh) for organizing Remedial Coaching Course for the next Academic Year i.e. for the year 2011. In the second year, the course was organized from 9th May 2011 to 29th Feb 2012. Altogether 2434 lectures were organized. After conducting the course, the fiscal appraisal and other reports were sent to UGC. The Commission was pleased with the reports and the overall performance, and for the year 2012 too a sum of Rs. 2,50,000/-(Rupees two lakh fifty thousand) was sanctioned. In the third year, the course was organized from 3rd Sept 2012 to 31st march 2013. Altogether 1222 lectures were organized. The Remedial Class was organized in subjects like : History, Economics, Pol.Science, Literature, Education. So consecutively for three years, we organized the Remedial Coaching Class.

The Remedial Coaching Courses were extremely useful to the students:

- a) in improving the academic skill and linguistic proficiency of the students in various subjects.
- b) to raise the level of comprehension of the subjects so as to provide a stronger foundation for further academic work.
- c) to strengthen their knowledge and skill in the subjects and
- d) to improve overall performance of the students in the examinations.

Most of the students of this College belongs to the Scheduled Tribe communities. They are deeply grateful to UGC for sanctioning funds for orgasing the course. As the Remedial Coaching Courses have been extremely beneficial to their academic and career advancements, they very much wish that the Course are conducted in the forthcoming years too.
