REPORT

INTRODUCTION:

Govt Khawzawl College started to have NCC for Senior Cadets in the year 2020. The College NCC was officially formulated on dt.01.04.2020 with the introduction of 'Border expansion' under 20 Mizoram Bn NCC, Aizawl. The first batch (2020-2021) consists of 20 cadets categorize in 10 SD (Senior Division for Man) & 10 SW (Senior Wing for Women). The present batch (2021-2022) also comprises 10 SD & 10 SW. Currently, 40 cadets are actively involved under the banner of NCC in Govt. Khawzawl College.

COLLEGE NCC ACTIVITIES: 2021-2022

Ever since offline classes were started after relaxation with Covid 19 SOP, NCC of this College unit also began its regular drill classes twice a week. Cadets are taught basic drills and discipline. Uniforms and boots are supplied from the headquarters to each cadet. A light refreshment also followed every classes.

Since the pandemic obstructs most of activities and also due to this College NCC being in its initial stages, not much of activities could have been reported. However, the following activities are carried out so far:

• CATC (Combine Annual Training Camp) was attended by 11 Cadets at Tanhril: Aizawl between 8th -17th December, 2021.



• And for the first time in the history of the college, 8 NCC students appeared in the 'B' Certificate Examination held on 09.04.2022 at Govt. Aizawl College. Now, the students are waiting for a good result to come out.

ADMISSION:

However, the seat for cadetship as of now is limited as the Headquarters could provide only for 10 SD & 10 SW in every batch. In the beginning of an academic season i.e July, an admission is sought for a new batch and students could avail membership by obtaining and submitting necessary forms and documents from the college NCC Office.
